



AUGUST GREENWAY REPORT

As I mentioned in the past, trails are continuing to grow in Fort Wayne and Allen County and with that there are improvements to be made to the existing path. Beginning in the middle of July and through most of August, improvements will be made to the Maumee Pathway between the Columbia Street Bridge and Tecumseh Street Bridge. The path will be resurfaced and widened. There will be temporary closures on the pathway. Trail users will be able to detour around the worksite when necessary by using Edgewater Avenue.

The detour around the Filtration Plant has worked out well, there has been asphalt placed over the gravel alley and a temporary asphalt path has been made along Spy Run for trail users. This makes it a lot friendlier for those who prefer narrower tires.



The picture to the left is the new home of Fort Wayne Outfitters and one of the owners is 3RVS member, Tim Hall. He is renovating the old Train Depot along the Greenway between the Harrison Street and Wells Street Bridges. He will rent Phat bikes and canoes. As well as carry some outdoor clothing and cool drinks. These anxious cyclists can hardly wait.

Other paths in development are:

The Yarnelle Trail to Jefferson Pointe Trail - widening of Jefferson Blvd has started and the trail is being laid down at the same time. Construction should be done in the few months.

Liberty Mills to Amber Rd Trail - Wayne Asphalt has started construction.
